In the spirit of Dr. Babcock’s gift, the house offers an affordable living option for its members. At a base rent of \$420 per month, Babcock is among the most reasonable of housing options on campus and includes all the following amenities:

- A fully furnished room
- Eight professionally prepared meals each week
- 24/7 kitchen access, storage, and basic groceries (i.e. bread, milk, eggs, cereal, etc.)
- Utilities
- High-speed wireless Internet and Hulu + Live TV
- Free printing
- Free laundry

Having lived in the Babcock house for the past two years, I can certainly vouch for the home-like atmosphere of the Babcock House. It has easily been the best decision of my college career, but to truly understand the benefits of this house I encourage you to experience it for yourself.
